
Al Infrastructure Investments


Earlier this year, global consultancies McKinsey and Grand View Research released projections that quantify the scale of physical infrastructure needed to support Al's rapid development. Global power demand from Al data centers is expected to surge from 44 gigawatts (GW) in 2025 to over 150 GW by 2030, more than tripling in just five years. At the same time, the Al-driven data center construction market is forecasted to exceed \$450 billion by the end of the decade, reflecting an unprecedented wave of capital allocation into compute infrastructure. These projections underscore the deep physical and financial commitments being made to sustain the next generation of Al models and workloads.











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
